Key Stage 1 RE	<p>The Focus of RE for KS1 enables children to;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • develop their substantive knowledge and understanding of religions and worldviews. • find out about simple examples of religion that are drawn from local, national and global contexts. • learn to use basic subject specific vocabulary. • raise questions and begin to express their own views in response to the material they learn about and in response to questions about their ideas.
Key Stage 2 RE	<p>The Focus of RE for KS2 enables children to;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • extend their knowledge and understanding of religions and worldviews, recognising their local, national and global contexts. • be introduced to an extended range of sources and subject specific vocabulary. • be encouraged to be curious and to ask increasingly challenging questions about religion, belief, values and human life. • learn to express their own ideas in response to the material they engage with, identifying relevant information, selecting examples and giving reasons to support their ideas and views.
